I discovered something this past year about quilters that I had never really appreciated before about this incredible craft. I really

got to understand that a quilt is not just a quilt. No, each carefully sewn quilt is an expression of the heart and soul of the quilter who made it. Every quilt tells a unique story as expressed by the quilter.

No matter the skill level nor the type of quilt, the medium remains the same: fabric, batting and thread. The mystery or the magic, if you are so inclined, is what happens to these raw materials when each quilter interprets these raw materials to create a one of a kind quilt. Each quilter expresses themselves in each of their quilts so differently than any other quilter. This is true artistry and a celebration of each quilter's expertise!



"real" buttons I wouldn't have attached them using Welbond! © However, if you remove them from the cupcake topper and soak the button/paper in water, you should be able to remove the paper and the glue from the button. Mine came off, with the baker's twine intact and even room to pull a thread through the button holes. Hopefully you will have the same luck! If you are having trouble, please let me know and I will get you another button. Looking forward to seeing your creations. Helen
