#### PROGRAM UPDATE by Pati

Our Quilted Hugs Shawl workshop was a great success despite our snowfall. Thanks to Holly for keeping us on track, looking forward to seeing our projects at our next Show and Tell.

February will bring our next "free sew day" on the 27th. Bring your own project to work on or join us in making blocks for CQA's most recent challenge. Check back on the Dec and Jan newsletter for instructions and information. If you can't join us, maybe you can make some blocks at home or if you have some extra white or solid red  $2\ 1/2$ " strips laying around at home, please bring them to our upcoming meeting and we will make good use of them. All blocks will be made into quilts for donation to Quilts of Valour for distribution to Canadian veterans.

In March, we will be working on a Jelly Roll Rug, you will have seen lots of pic's of these if you spend any time on the internet. You will need 1 jelly roll and lots of batting strips for this one. We still have room if you are interested.

We are still finalizing plans for the April workshop with Syd Hughes. Australian Trad Jazz quilt. See Pati if you are interested.

May – no workshop, but we will have our AGM and potluck luncheon before we wind up for the summer.

We will continue working on our after-meeting project on Feb 13, so don't forget to bring your projects along with you. You will also need to bring along some 12" squares of muslin with batting and backing in case you are ready to start practicing some stitching but first we will need to draw in some of the quilting lines on our project. Hi there,

I'm your new quilt. I was created by a Grandmother woman in Pennsylvania. She has told me that I have a home with you now; that you will now be my little person. I am thrilled, because it's every quilt's dream to get to belong to a little person. I will love you alot! On cold chilly nights, I will cover you and keep you warm. I love to play so spread me on the floor and play on me. I like to travel, take me on trips with you and I will keep you company. And if you get hurt or sick, hold me close and squeeze me tight and I will do everything I can to make you feel better. With just alittle Care, I will be around a long time to love you. When I get dirty, put me in the washer—I prefer cold water please, and any laundry detergent you like to use. Never use bleach on me, not even that bleach stuff that's suppose to be safe for colors. And oh....no dry cleaning! That is just too harsh for me. Please be gentle when you take me out of the washer—when I am soaking wet I can be alittle vulnerable and if you pull and tug hard on me while I am like this, it could hurt my stitching. Knock me loose in the washer first and gently

lift me out. Put me in a nice warm dryer...not real hot! But be sure to take me out when I am dry: sitting in a cold dryer can make me wrinkle and I always want to look my best for you. I can even be used as a decoration in your room. I can look quite nice hanging on a wall. If you use me as a wall hanging, please keep in mind that sun rays shining through a window on me every day over time can hurt my colors. And....if you ever get too big for me and you don't need me anymore please don't discard me. Have me "rolled" up and put me in a plastic bag with air holes. I will need a few small air holes, and then put me away in a dry, dark place. And then someday....when you become a big person....maybe you will have alittle person of your own. And then maybe....just maybe....you can get me out and let me love again!




